Boozhoo Everyone:

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Andy Graham and I am the Director of Education for Lac des Mille Lacs First Nation. I am very excited to be part of such an amazing team here in the community. I have been working in Education for over 30 years and, until recently, was Director of Education for Bimose Tribal Council. While working at Bimose Tribal Council, I developed a close connection with the community and was very pleased to be selected as Director of Education. I look forward to implementing the vision of the First Nation for life-long learning.

As you may be aware, the Education department has expanded over the past few months. This is largely due to the successful proposals that we have submitted for new program funding. Through the Ontario Ministry of Education, the community has been able to access additional program funding. Under the Early Years Initiative, the First Nation has received a one-year funding agreement to implement a program for children ages 0-6 and their families that will focus on enhancing language learning and traditional teachings. We also received funding for one year under the Indigenous Language Initiative to run similar programming for youth from JK to Grade 12. This program also provides funding for weekly family language classes. We are still awaiting word from Indigenous Services Canada on other proposals and initiatives.



Over the next few months, the Education Department will be working on the development of a 4 Year Education Strategic Plan. The development of this plan will involve community discussion so that we can get solid feedback and direction from the membership. The first step in the process involves a survey that will be sent out to all community members. We hope to receive valuable input so that we can begin to develop the overall objectives and outcome for our programs and plan.

If you know of a student who is graduating Elementary or Secondary school in June 2018, please see info below on how to nominate them for an award.


In addition, Grade 12 graduates will receive an additional **Bimose OSSD Graduate award** in the amount of \$50 and a plaque.
