The tri-stream model is contingent upon sufficient interest and number of registered students.

Lac des Mille Lacs First Nation will be offering an Early Anishinaabe Language Program. The goal of Language Immersion streams is to develop proficiency in Ojibway and/or Cree Language. In all three streams, students will learn and develop an understanding and appreciation for the Anishinaabe culture. The curriculum content will be the same as the Ontario English curriculum, except that students will receive their classroom instruction in Ojibway, Cree or Non-Immersion streams.

Overall Role

The Elementary Teacher(s) is responsible for delivering age appropriate curriculum at the Lac des Mille Lacs Education Centre - Elementary School. The Elementary School Teacher(s) will ensure language and culture is central in all of our curriculum program and service delivery. The Elementary School Teacher reports directly to the School Principal and Education Director.

Required Skills & Qualifications
