LDMLFN Commemorates Historic Signing of Flood Claim Settlement

Commmunity Elders, Chief and Council and visiting dignitiaries gathered together in ceremony to commemorate the official signing of the flood claim settlement out at the LDMLFN Community Cultural Complex on June 20, 2017. Among those in attendance were Grand Council Treaty #3 Ogichidaa Francis Kavanaugh, MPP Bill Mauro and the Honourable David Zimmer, Ontario Minister of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation. Members of the Negotiations Team for the First Nation, Canada and Ontario were also in attendance for this historic event.

Achieved through negotiation and in a spirit of partnership, this historic claim settlement resolves a

specific flooding dispute between the parties that has been outstanding for more than 145 years. The negotiated settlement provides approximately \$77 million in financial compensation for damages and includes a flooding easement.





"This settlement will have positive, far reaching effects for our people and community, now and into the future. We truly appreciate the tireless work of our Negotiations Team and the involvement of our members to ensure that an acceptable outcome was realized throughout this lengthy process. Today is dedicated to all of our relatives who have gone on ahead of us and who prayed and dreamed that this day would come, " said Chief White Cloud.
